

Laetare Sunday

Once I was presiding at the Eucharist wearing the rose vestments on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. In my homily, I explained why the priest wears this color, which is not very often used in the liturgy. Some people said to me, "Father, you look very nice in 'pink' ", or "this is a very unusual color in Church." These were nice comments, but the most significant comment that day for me came from a 4 year old boy. After Mass, he came to me, looked at me, and said, "Father... don't wear pink... pink is for girls." His parents, people who were there, and me just laughed. I knelt down to his level, smiled, and said to him, "thank you very much for your words... I will keep in mind what you said to me." He smiled with me at that moment. Even though I continue to wear the "pink" color because this is a suggestion by the Church (it is not obligatory to wear this color), I remember in a special way this boy who reminded me of the simplicity of the gospel, and how God expresses His love through these "little ones"

The little boy saw a color that in his understanding was only for girls, not for boys. In the understanding of the Church this color is used to manifest the joy that we feel for knowing that the Lord Jesus Christ came to save all of us. To see the priest wearing the "pink" or "rose" color should produce in us a big smile because this color is telling us that the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ is coming soon. We smile because we are happy. We smile because Jesus gave us salvation and eternal life through His Death and Resurrection. For this reason, the priest wears the "rose" color. A color which is a combination of two colors: red, which means the Passion and Death, the blood that Jesus shed for us on the Cross, and white which is the color of the resurrection. I learned in elementary school that red and white produces "pink" or "rose."

This Fourth Sunday of Lent is called *Laetare Sunday* or Sunday of Rejoicing, and it is very different from *Gaudete Sunday* which is celebrated on the Third Sunday of Advent. This one also means joy. However, the joy of Advent is because the savior of the world is coming on Christmas, but the joy of Lent is because Christ saved us through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. "In Lent it comes in the form of *Laetare Sunday* and in Advent it comes in the form of *Gaudete Sunday*. Both days get their name from Latin roots which are principally used to express joy. The difference between the two is that Laetare reflects a joy that is manifest outwardly whereas Gaudete reflects a way of rejoicing internally" (https://gezemiah.wordpress.com/2018/12/15/gaudete-v-laetare/).

It does not matter what you call this color, "pink" or "rose." The most important thing is to start to celebrate the joy of the Risen Lord. Let us prepare ourselves for the coming celebration of Easter with joy and always have a thanksgiving attitude toward the Lord.

FAITH FORMATION and YOUTH MINISTRY

Confirmation – Did you know?

There are many components included in our parish Confirmation program including Catechesis, Worship, Community, Service, Parent & Sponsor Involvement, Retreat, and Ongoing Formation. The journey toward Confirmation for our youth also involves what is known as *Remote* and *Immediate* Preparation. Remote preparation refers to the years of catechesis prior to one's eligibility to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Immediate preparation refers to catechesis and formation related specifically to the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Our parish youth are now in that time of preparation that no longer focuses on the general teachings of our faith, but rather centers specifically on the sacrament itself. How Confirmation increases and deepens the grace of Baptism, strengthening the baptismal conferral of the Holy Spirit to incorporate them more firmly in Christ, strengthening their bond with the Church. They are discovering the ways in which God's grace in the Sacrament of Confirmation associates them more closely with the Church's mission, increases in them the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and helps them bear witness to the Christian faith in words and deeds. Our last few weeks of preparation will focus on their mission of Christian discipleship lived in the context of a Catholic community exploring the activity of the Holy Spirit in their individual lives and in the life of the Church.

Confirmation is not a form of graduation, nor does it mark the end of one's formation. Faith Formation is a lifelong process. We invite each of you to keep these students, their families and sponsors, and their catechists in your prayers, especially in these coming weeks.

In early 2021 the finances of Cabrini Parish forced the decision to close Saint Michael Church on N Clinton and Clifford, thankfully such decision was delayed for some months which allowed for some creative thinking as to how to better use all the unused buildings the parish was holding in great locations to provide services to the community. In July 2021, the idea of Rochester Hope was conceived, under the direction of Father Daniel Ruiz, as a separate not-for-profit nonreligious corporation to relieve the parish of the upkeep of its unused buildings and bring services and caring hands to the heart of our city. In January 2022, Rochester Hope was incorporated as a 501(c)3 and begun activities with a Food Pantry and Services Fair every Saturday from 9 AM to 3 PM. Expenses to purchase food from Food Link runs \$1500.00 a week. There is such a huge need, and so much remains to accomplish. With your most generous donation we can achieve it together!
