

The Most Important Week of the Year

I came to the United States in 2009. Little by little I started not only to learn English, but also to learn about American culture. All of its traditions were new to me. Thanksgiving, Christmas, St. Patrick's Day, Easter, the Fourth of July, etc. Once, I was chatting with a friend, and he asked me about the celebration of Holy Week in the United States. Immediately, I started to remember the way that we celebrated Holy Week in Colombia, and of course, it was very different. Colombia has a lot of processions, a lot of people, activities for children, youth, and adults. Long lines of people waiting for their turn to go to the sacrament of Reconciliation, long ceremonies (people do not care about time), and even the Easter Vigil was a long celebration (around 4 hours). Of course, all of these flashbacks happened in a second. I then described the way Americans celebrate the Holy Week, which of course was very different. My friend said to me that Holy Week in America was "boring." I laughed and explained that Holy week in America is just very different.

I believe that even though there are not the same expressions of faith during the most important week of the year for all Christian people, the Americans have wonderful expressions of faith because they understand the real importance of this week (At least, I want to believe so).

We praise the Lord on Palm Sunday and recognize Jesus not only as the King of the Jews, but also as the King of the Universe. He is the King of our lives. We praise Him with palms saying, "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest" (Matthew 21:9).

On Holy Thursday we celebrate the sacrament of Love, the Eucharist. At the Last Supper, Our Lord Jesus Christ wanted to stay with us in the bread and wine. We need to say to the Lord "thank you" for all the wonderful gifts that the Lord gave us in this Supper.

On Good Friday Jesus died for us on the Cross. He cleansed us of our sins through His sacrifice because by the Holy Cross, He has redeemed the world. We call this day "Good" not because it was good to see a man die on a Cross, but by the act of Jesus through His death, He restored our friendship with God.

On Easter vigil the Christians rejoice at the triumphant Resurrection of the Lord. St. Paul says, "If Christ has not been raised, then empty [too] is our preaching; empty, too, your faith" (1 Cor. 15, 14). Easter Vigil is the center of our faith. The resurrection of Christ gave us hope and the possibility to go to the house of our Heavenly Father.

Even though the way Christians celebrate Holy Week is different, we have the same spirit. The Lord Jesus saved all of us regardless of our traditions, nationality, language, or culture. We commemorate His passion, death, and resurrection. We live these sacred mysteries with faith and love. We say thank you to the Lord for His sacrifice on the Cross and His resurrection from death.

God bless you, and may the Blessed Virgin be with you always

Becoming Catholic



Palm Sunday (the Sunday immediately before Easter Sunday) is when we commemorate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem before his crucifixion. At the original Palm Sunday (which we can read about in Matthew 21:1–11), many people spread their cloaks and palm branches on the road to prepare a path for Jesus as he entered the city where he would ultimately be crucified. Today, our parish and many others will commemorate Jesus' triumphal procession into Jerusalem by passing out palm fronds at all Masses.

The Eucharistic Revival: A Year of Parish Revival

Session 3: Jesus and the Eucharist. Am I Saved?

During the season of Lent, we often hear about the Salvation that Christ offered to us through His sacrifice on the Cross. It is not uncommon for some to interpret God's gift as a right, requiring no action on their part. Christ's plan for salvation requires us to take an active role in our personal salvation.

First, we need to heed the call to become disciples of Jesus. Each of us has a personal call to live the way Christ instructed. Seeking a life of righteousness includes evangelization of our faith. We should do our best to spread the message of the Gospels to others. This call is not easy in a society that discourages us from discussing our faith. The easiest place to start is in our own homes, the Domestic Church. Further, stay attentive to those in your life that may need to hear the Word and are receptive to its message. God often presents opportunities that help us to live the call of spreading the Gospel.

Our human nature, at times, is drawn toward sin. Don't lose hope because God's redeeming grace is always active in our lives. This grace comes to us in the sacraments. Baptism is the first way that sin is forgiven. The forgiveness of sin through baptism is so effective, that there was a time in the early Church where Baptism was withheld until an individual was near death (read about St. Augustine!). This is not necessary because we are able to receive forgiveness for our sins just as effectively through the sacrament to Penance. Make it a point to go regularly. It shouldn't be scary because God anticipated our occasional sin and offered us a way to restore our communion with Him. We are blessed with priests at Holy Trinity who long to help us restore our relationship with God.

The Eucharist is another sacrament that must be noted for its role in salvation. In Jesus' own words: *Drink of it, all of you for this is my blood of the Covenant which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins*. (Mt 26:26) At the Last Supper when Jesus gave us the Eucharist, we were told that the effect of the Eucharist would be the forgiveness of sins and our eternal salvation. The Catechism tells us that if the Eucharist is to unite us to Christ, it must first cleanse us from our past venial sins and preserve us from future mortal sins. By participating in the Eucharist, Jesus' risen body, we are well on the way to being able to say, "Yes, I am saved, because Jesus said I would be."

As part of Holy Week, come join us as Holy Trinity continues its seven-part video and discussion series with "Am I Saved?" <u>Our next meeting is Wednesday, March 27 at 6:30pm in Trinity Hall.</u> Sign up is located in the Gathering Space, but of course, if you find yourself available, all are welcome! More information about the movement can be found at <u>www.eucharisticrevival.org</u>, and on the posters around the church.
