

For forty days we, the followers of Christ, were in a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We were preparing ourselves during that time to celebrate the most important mystery of our faith: the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Resurrection of Christ came three days after His death. This is a great teaching for all of us because not only with the death and resurrection of Jesus we were saved from the slavery of sin, but also, we receive a message of hope. This message tells us that among the darkness that we are living with, we see the light of hope. The light, the Risen Lord, who triumphantly rose from the dead, is saying to us that we cannot fear, especially at this time of crisis in which humanity is living. We need to rejoice not only because Jesus rose from the dead, but because He is always with us. He is the only one who can help us in moments of distress and sorrow. We need to rejoice because the Lord has changed our mourning into dancing; He took off our sackcloth and clothed us with gladness (cf. Psalm 30:12).


"Pope Francis reminds us in *Evangelii Gaudium* that Christ's resurrection is not an event of the past; something that happened to Jesus 2000 years ago. Rather it is a vital power, an irresistible force permeating the world. He reminds us that there are signs of resurrection everywhere transforming situations of injustice, evil, indifference and cruelty. He says: 'Where all seems to be dead, signs of the resurrection suddenly spring up. However dark things are, goodness always re-emerges and spreads' (EG 276). And we, missionary disciples, are instruments of that transformation" (https://www.holyfamilybordeaux.org/reflection/the-joy-of-the-resurrection/).

Our mission as Jesus' disciples is to share the Risen Lord with our brothers and sisters who lose hope, are in sorrow, and do not see the light. Our mission is to tell others that Jesus is alive, and He will give us strength in difficult times of our lives. Let us feel the joy of the Risen Lord and share this joy with our brothers and sisters who need a word of hope.

May the Risen Lord be with all of you!


ALLELUIA!

The resurrection of Jesus from the dead is the foundation of the entire Christian faith. If Jesus didn't rise from the dead, we should all go home and forget about it. As St. Paul himself puts it: "*if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain, your faith also is in vain.*" (I Corinthians 15:14) But Jesus was, in fact, raised from the dead. And his resurrection shows that Christ can gather back to the Father everyone whom he has embraced through his suffering love.

Did you know that each of the stained-glass windows you see in our church tells a very special story about our faith? Look to the large windows on the East side of our main nave and you will find one showing a cross and a crown in the left panel and the lamb in the right panel. Saint John the Baptist said to Jesus, "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." (John 1:29) We usually think of the lamb as victim, as we read in Isaiah 53:7, "He was like a lamb led to the slaughter." But in our window the banner-bearing lamb signifies the risen Jesus, triumphant in victory over the cross. The cross-emblazoned banner is a sign of triumph. The left panel gives a similar symbol with the crown indicating victory over the cross. The cross in Jesus' time was a sign of degradation, corruption and humiliation, but Jesus made it a Christian sign of serving, contradicting its former meaning. The left window was donated by Joseph and Katharina Zimmer and the right by Katharina Miller.

The Eucharistic Revival: A Year of Parish Revival

Reflecting on Session 3: Jesus and the Eucharist. Am I Saved?

Session three was a great reminder that we are saved. We may all view salvation differently, but we were reminded that salvation is more than just avoiding hell. Salvation applies to the here and now because, as humans with free will, we are enslaved by our sins. While this fact may cause us to despair, even St. Peter, the rock on which Christ's Church was built, was aware of his own sinfulness when he told Jesus "Go away from me, Lord, because I am a sinful man (Lk 5:8)." God foresaw our sinfulness and offered us a way to be saved. Like Peter, we are imperfect, but that doesn't mean God will abandon us. On the contrary, the Lord continually offers us salvation. The Eucharist is a reminder of this, and it plays an important role in our salvation. Receive it often, and with reverence, for the Eucharist was given to us by Jesus for the forgiveness of sins and life everlasting.

Thank you to all that joined us for Session 3 of the Eucharistic Revival video series. Just a reminder that if you have not had an opportunity to join us, each session is a unique topic. You can join at any time without feeling like you are behind.

Come join us for the next enlightening video, sure to teach you something new, followed by informal conversation that, has been both natural and informative. Our next topic is "Why a Church?" 
