



This is some important information for all of us.

May is a month that the Catholic Church has consecrated to our mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. People pray the rosary, crown Mary, or have a personal and special devotion to the Mother of God. On **May 12, we celebrate also our Mother's Day, and we will have the crown of Mary**. Let us ask Mary, our heavenly mother, to intercede not only for our mothers, but for all mothers in the world. The Blessed Virgin Mary has been present in human history through her different apparitions. Our Lady of Guadalupe, Our Lady of Chinquiquirá, Our Lady of the Rosary, Our Lady of Fatima, Our Lady of Lourdes, Our Lady of the Mount Carmel, Our Lady of the Snow, Our Lady of the Milk, Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal, Our Lady of Graces, Our Lady

of La Salette, Our Lady of Knock, Our Lady of the Good Event, Our Lady of Laus, Our Lady of Good Help, Our Lady of Pontmain, Our Lady of Hope, Our Lady of Gietrzwałd, etc., are some of the apparitions of our Blessed Virgin throughout the world. They are manifestations of God's love to us regardless the culture, nationality, language, or race. For this reason, this month is consecrated to her, so that all humankind can praise the Lord through the presence of our Blessed Mother.

The Roman Catholic Church will celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Let us remember that this day is one of the Holy Days of obligation. It is very important that we do not confuse the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord with the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary to Heaven. In the Ascension, Jesus ascends to Heaven by His own power and will because Jesus is divine (let us remember that Jesus is 100% God and 100% human being). On the other hand, Mary, who is only a human being, goes to Heaven by the power of God. God took her to Heaven. The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is one of the most important solemnities in the Roman Catholic Church, and it is described in Mark 16:19, Luke 24:50–51, and Acts 1:2–11. This special moment in the life of the Lord and the Church happened 40 days after the Resurrection of the Lord. **This Solemnity will be celebrated on May 9<sup>th</sup>**. **Here, at Holy Trinity Church, we will have two Masses: 9:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.** Let us participate in this celebration as the family who we are.

On May 19<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost. We will celebrate that day the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Roman Catholic Church. We ask each one of you to be in red that day as a sign that the Holy Spirit is coming and is in each of us. In addition, we will start to pray the Novena to the Holy Spirit from May 10<sup>th</sup> to 18. This Novena will be prayed after the homily in daily Mass, and before starting the Eucharist on weekend masses. I encourage you to pray this Novena and ask for the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit.

God bless you, and may the Blessed Virgin Mary be with you always!

# The Eucharistic Revival: A Year of Parish Revival

Session 6: Jesus and the Eucharist. The Story of the Eucharist

If you were leading a RCIA class and were asked to tell the story of the Eucharist, I am willing to bet that you would do an admirable job recalling the accounts of the Last Supper in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. If you are really good, you may point out that the Gospel of John doesn't mention the Last Supper, but it does include the Bread of Life Discourse. If any of the above are included in your Eucharistic story, you get a gold star. The truth is, the story of the Eucharist actually starts in the *Old Testament,* in many places.

Let's start with the Israelites, at the time that they were enslaved in Egypt. God selected Moses to lead them out of exile and into the promised land, said to flow with milk (abundance) and honey (prosperity). Their time spent in the desert after leaving Egypt was a long, tough period. Before long, the Israelites began to murmur against God and Moses because they felt they would certainly starve to death. Once again, God met their needs by providing food for them to eat, manna. Each night, this "bread from heaven" would descend and the Israelites simply needed to collect it in the morning so that their bodies would be sustained. The only hitch was that manna could only be kept for one day before it would become corrupted. Through the ages, the Jews saw Moses as a prophet like no other. They accepted that there would never again be one like him, until the Messiah came. This Messiah would be recognized because he would come, bearing manna. Don't forget that the Old Testament predicts the New Testament fulfills the Old, in excess. How can you exceed bread from Heaven?

When Jesus entered His public ministry, He found the Jewish people were waiting for the Messiah, who they expected to bring manna. This was evident when Jesus was giving the Bread of Life Discourse in Capernaum. The audience sought a sign, like their fathers received when God gave them manna in the desert. Jesus instructed them, "Do not labor for food which perishes (manna), but for food that which endures to eternal life (Jn 6:27)." Jesus tells the crowd, "I am the living bread which comes down from heaven, if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh (Jn 6:51)." When the crowd goes on to request the bread of which Jesus is speaking, He reveals "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst (Jn 6:35)." The Bread of Life is Christ's flesh, given to us in the



Eucharist. As predicted in the Old Testament, the Messiah did bring Bread from Heaven. He is this Bread. The Eucharist is food that does not perish, it nourishes us spiritually and grants us eternal life.

Join us again, or for the first time, at the next session, "The Story of the Eucharist". We will gather <u>Thursday</u>, <u>May 9 at 6:30pm in Trinity Hall</u>. Sign up is in the Gathering Space, but of course, if you find yourself available, all are welcome!
