


The Advocate



We, Catholics, believe that God is only one and at the same time is three different persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Probably, we have heard very much about the Father and the Son, but a little bit about the Holy Spirit. So, who is the Holy Spirit?

The Church, after receiving the Holy Spirit in the day of Pentecost, started to believe in the Holy Spirit as a member of the Holy Trinity, and it is present in the Creed of the Apostles, "I believe in the Holy Spirit." However, this is not enough to try to understand who really the Holy Spirit is. In 325 AD, the Church talks about Jesus in the Council of Nicaea, and in 385 AD, the Church in the First Council of Constantinople talks about the third person of the Trinity. Both councils made the Creed that all of us profess every Sunday and in Solemnities. This creed is called the Nicaea-Constantinople creed, better called as the Nicaea Creed. The third part of this creed says about the Holy Spirit, "I believe

in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets."

If we study only the third part of the Creed, we probably could talk for hours about this. However, I want to highlight this first part that says, "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life." The Holy Spirit gives the reason of our existence. Without the Holy Spirit, probably you and I would not be here. The Holy Spirit transforms our reality and helps us to listen better to God's voice. The Holy Spirit sustains the Church; therefore, regardless of all the problems that the Church has had, she continues working for the Kingdom of God.

My brothers and sisters, it is more important to feel the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives than to know a lot of theology about Him. Let us say not only in Pentecost, but every day of our lives, "Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth" (cf. Psalm 104).

The Eucharistic Revival: A Year of Parish Revival

Session 7: Jesus and the Eucharist. Bread for the Journey

When my boys were little, my wife and I often found ourselves in a position to be able to take a family vacation. Though our trips were never more than a week, my wife always diligently packed enough food to sustain us for 40 years in the desert. One big component of this stockpile was the snack bag, meant to be enjoyed on the journey to our destination. Though the drive may have felt long, we always had plenty to eat along the way. While this food sustained us during our travels, it offered nothing for our spiritual journeys. Fortunately, there is a special food for this journey.

In previous weeks, we learned that Jesus, in the Bread of Life Discourse, instructed His followers, "Do not labor for food which perishes (manna), but for food that which endures to eternal life (Jn 6:27)." We all have a physical need to eat, but Jesus was talking about the Eucharist, the food that He would give to us so that we may be spiritually nourished in our faith journey to heaven. Through the Eucharist, we can experience a part of heaven while we are still on earth. This is possible because the Eucharist allows us to experience a communion with God. We experience this communion, not individually, but with others in the Pilgrim Church.

In *Evangelii Gaudium*, Pope Francis insists that the Church is "first and foremost a people advancing on its pilgrim way towards God." Our individual experiences on the journey may differ, but since we are all seeking the same reward, the Kingdom of Heaven, we are traveling together. The journey toward God is not meant to be traveled individually, it is meant to be done with the Communion of Saints. The Communion of Saints is made up of all the Church's faithful on the journey, living and dead, past, present, and future. This is a very large group that can only be unified by the food that Christ gave us for the journey, the Eucharist. May we all worthily receive this gift through our faith and works. As we journey together, the Eucharist will sustain us so that we

may bring the Good News to others, and they may enter the journey with us.



As we prepare for the final session, I would like to thank everyone who attended the Eucharistic Revival video series over the past three months. It has been a blessing to learn more about the Eucharist with you and to discuss our faith together. I would also like to thank Fr. Jorge and the staff at Holy Trinity for all the support that they gave to the revival team. You foresaw our needs and contributed more than you will ever realize. Finally, the Eucharistic Revival would not have been possible without the team that helped to make each session possible. A heartfelt thank you to Will and Linda Trout, Barb Drouin, Jean Wolf, and Elaine Eggert. You have truly answered the New Evangelization call to "deepen our faith, believe

in the Gospel message, and go forth to proclaim the Gospel."

CPR/AED Training at Holy Trinity


